Gordon Wilson advised the meeting that Geoff Hale was happy to speak with the Parish Council about designs for the Village sign. It was noted that Chiseldon, Wanborough,and Bishopstone Parish Councils are keen to join Liddington in sorting out broadband for the rural areas.

The main topics that the Parish Council would like to discuss with Nerissa Vaughan (Great Western Hospital) are parking at the hospital, Commonhead/Coate development and its impact on the hospital, expansions plans in line with 2026 Swindon Plan, merging of the ambulance service and first responders, impact of Wanborough & Liddington being served by a satellite of the Ramsbury surgery particularly as the surgery is under a different health aurhority, progress made on radiotherapy proposals and her aspirations for the hospital (except for the radiotherapy). Andrew Bennett advised the meeting that UKB are happy to meet with Parish Councils to discuss what they can provde in terms of broadband.

5. MATTERS

FOR CONSIDERATION

5.1 Parking – Issues with parking when Wanborough Youth Football club are using the playing field were discussed. It was noted that a resident had complained that flower pots were moved to make space for vehicles and some of these had been broken. The signs on the elft just before Parsonage Yard are not visible. The resident of

Parsonage Yard had agreed to a 'Private. No Entry' sign be placed on the wall on the right. The football club need to put up temporary signs when a match is on advising visitors of any parking restrictions.

5.2 Commonhead Phase 1 Design Codes – The Parish Council review and discussed the comments made in response to the Design Codes consultation.

5.3 Commonhead/Coate Development - It was noted that Dayhouse Lane will not be closed until works starts on the development of the employment land, which is the last phase. Andrew Bennett advised the meeting that the closure of Dayhouse lane was part of the proposal that was agreed by the Secretary of State and as such it may be a condition that can not be removed or varied.
